SYNOPSIS

EPISODE 01 THE AMERICAN


After being convicted of murder and escaping from jail, George Wright hijacked a plane with a million dollars. That day, he left the US and the FBI lost track of him.


EPISODE 03 THE PORTUGUESE

AUTHOR'S NOTE

The only thing I knew for sure was that Jorge Santos' story was still untold. A young black man gets involved in a murder, escapes from jail, hijacks a plane with a million dollars in ransom and lives one of the longest escapes from justice ever: it lasted 40 years and crossed 3 continents.

These were the facts. But his story was mainly about a legal dilemma. What would be fair in a case where the convict has rebuilt his life, but the victim's family feels he hasn't paid for his crimes? How to reconcile a criminal justice system such as that in the United States, where homicide crimes do not have a statute of limitations, with that of several European countries, including Portugal, where the right to forget is a value to be preserved?

Above all, there was the human side. A man trapped in a secret, carrying an inner loneliness. A lifetime of hiding the past, floating between two dimensions: the person he really was and the one he showed the world. What would be left of this person who fed on shadows and invisibility? Deep down, I was interested in understanding how life shapes us.

What started as an "authorized biography" became an investigation into the odyssey of this American man, who was born George Wright and became the Portuguese Jorge Santos. Even if it's still wrapped in mystery, there's one thing I've found out: how he managed to escape the FBI.

With a Law degree, Sofia has a 30-year career as a journalist specializing in justice and human rights, and is the author of renowned series in Portugal such as *Perdidos e Achados* (2006), *Condenados* (2010), *A Prova* (2013), *Vidas Suspensas* (2017), *Invisíveis* (2019), *Mercado Negro* (2020) and *Despojos de Guerra* (2022).

As a screenwriter, she wrote the docudrama *O Último Corretor* (1996), the fiction series *O Espírito da Lei* (2001), the documentary *Carta ao meu Avô* (2015) and *Daniel e Daniela* (2022), which she also directed.

Sofia has published four books: *Jornalistas e Tribunais* (2005), *As Extraordinárias Aventuras da Justiça Portuguesa* (2009), *O meu Avô Luís* (2015) and *Condenados* (2017). Among other awards, she has twice won Best Information Program from the Portuguese Society of Authors, Best Use of Archive from the International Federation of Television Archives and the Special Jury Prize at the Cartagena de las Indias Film Festival in Colombia.

Received the Netflix award for best Portuguese documentary screenplay in 2020.
